School Trustee report: Gordon Swan

This election year is a good opportunity to send something to each of the parties asking if they are willing to increase that funding (check with BCCPAC for more resources and support on this)

The gaming grants have decreased by half from \$40 per student to only \$20 per student. It is time for Parents to ask questions of the Ministry of Finance why the funding is cut to an all time low when cost of living and inflation have skyrocketed.

Applications for funding from the Gaming Grant Commission have been made for the 2024-2025 school year. Grant amounts are determined by October 2024 by using the school's 1701 reports based on the number of (FTE) full time enrolled students.

The School Board is making a request to increase funding for rural districts which is based per capita or fte basis (full time enrollment). In larger districts they receive more funding because they have more students and are able to spread the funding. We are receiving 178,000.00 for bussing and our costs are close to 700,000.00. Rural communities do not have robust public transportation systems in place to aid students arriving at school. Rural areas like ours are dependent on our bussing system.

Enrollment is up to 621 students, welcoming 141 Grade 8 students as its largest cohort.

There will be a Grade 8 Parents meeting next Wednesday September 18th.

Today was the first student led assembly run by 2 leadership classes, grade 9/10 and 11/12. They are working on building a stronger student voice. These assemblies are run by the students, for the students. Topics highlight student activities, extracurricular student achievements and accolades.

The new cell phone policy is going very well so far.

Treasurer's report: Quinn Rooke

Gaming account has a balance of \$64.03. The Main Operating account 215.52

BCCPAC fees are coming due for 2024-2025. The fees have increased from \$75 to \$100.

Surplus accounts \$886.67. We approved volleyball jerseys to be paid out in the amount of <-258.29> and the writing competition for <-300.00>. And the art collection left a surplus of +88.92. The remaining balance of the \$417.30 will be put towards the Soccer jerseys. This brings our previous MSS accounts surplus to zero.
